

Privacy Declaration

The protection of your personal data is of particular concern to us. We therefore process your data exclusively on the basis of the statutory provisions (GDPR, TKG 2003). In this privacy information, we inform you about the most important aspects of data processing in connection with our website.

Scope

This privacy policy is intended to inform users of this website about the nature, scope, and purpose of the collection and use of personal data by the website operator. The website operator takes your data protection very seriously and treats your personal data confidentially and in accordance with the applicable legal provisions. Please note that data transmission over the Internet may in principle be subject to security vulnerabilities. Complete protection against access by third parties is not possible.

Access Data

The website operator or page provider collects data about accesses to the site and stores them as “server log files”. The following data is logged:

- Visited website
- Time at the point of access
- Amount of data sent in bytes
- Source/reference from which you reached the page
- Browser used
- Operating system used
- IP address used

The collected data is used solely for statistical analysis and to improve the website. However, the website operator reserves the right to retrospectively check the server log files if there are concrete indications of unlawful use.

Handling of Contact Data

If you contact the website operator using the contact options provided, your details will be stored so that they can be used to process and respond to your inquiry. These data will not be passed on to third parties without your consent. Personal data includes all information that serves to identify your person and can be traced back to you — for example, your name, email address, and telephone number.

Your Rights

You are generally entitled to the rights of access, rectification, erasure, restriction of processing, data portability, revocation, and objection.

If you believe that the processing of your data violates data protection law or that your data protection rights have otherwise been infringed, you may lodge a complaint with the supervisory authority. In Austria, this is the Data Protection Authority (Datenschutzbehörde).

As a user, you have the right to receive free information on request about which personal data concerning you has been stored. Provided that your request does not conflict with a statutory obligation to retain data (e.g. data retention requirements), you have the right to have incorrect data corrected and to have your personal data blocked or deleted.
